Stuart Smith once again operated the electronic starter to start the race and used his hitec timing device (electric egg timer). There were problems with bird feathers. Thanks to Terry Scarth, Roger Shepherd and Stan Reffin for overseeing the race. Mick Hebden has a very short lead over the rest of the field.

We have been notified by Kirklees Council that their insurers require us to increase our public liability insurance from £5 million to £10 million with immediate effect. This will mean an increase in the premium for 2018/19 of approximately £62.00.

**Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> March – Container cleaning and making out new inventory** – we have now purchased 3 new tables for the catering tent and also we propose to purchase a further 6 mtr x 3 mtr tent. Some members are now wishing to display some model tanks at our 3 open days and have requested from the committee to purchase timber to construct some buildings for their display, which will hopefully be flat pack. With the above in mind we now need to empty the container, dispose of any old or broken equipment, see how much spare space we have and also complete an up to date inventory. Weather permitting on site for 9 am. We hope to be finished for after lunch. Free tea and coffee will be available throughout the morning. If you are going to attend to help, please use the bottom car park near the playground. If you are coming to help can you please let either Stan or Pat know down at the lakeside, by e-mail or by telephone on 0113 2675790.

**Steam Day 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2018 from 8 am VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED** - As usual we will have a catering tent serving refreshments throughout the day. Can I please ask for contributions for the catering tent of sandwiches, cakes, buns, savouries, biscuits, crisps etc. which can be sold on the day. Everything must be wrapped in cling film or plastic bags and labelled accordingly. Volunteers will also be needed to help with the erection of the tents from 8 am. Richard Simpson will be carrying out boiler testing by prior arrangement. We also need members to stay to the end and help with dismantling the tents and returning everything to the club container.

**Data Protection Act** - A new revised Data Protection Act will be implemented in May 2018. The new Act will require the Club to demonstrate how we store members' details whether this be electronically or on paper records. We have in place a draft document but it will need fine tuning after liaising with Southern Federation. We will not be able to store any personal information on the website. The membership form for new members will have to be amended showing they have no objection to us storing their details. You can be assured that any personal details are not given out without the prior consent of the affected member. This applies to somebody asking for another member's telephone number, e-mail, or address. Underneath is the draft document but as already stated, is subject to change.

## **Changes to Data Protection – how we store information - DRAFT COPY ONLY**

In May 2018 new legislation will come into force. This will effect businesses and even small clubs and societies. It doesn't matter whether you store information electronically or on the back of a cigarette packet you will have to show how you protect your members' information.

1 KMBC store information electronically on the Secretary's PC and is password protected and on the Treasurer's laptop which is also password protected. The information stored only includes names, addresses, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses. No information is recorded regarding date of birth or bank details.

2 In the event of a member requiring other members' information this will not be disclosed without the consent of the person concerned. If the person concerned is happy for this information to be disclosed to a third party, then the information will be given. This transaction will be recorded electronically on a spreadsheet showing the date and relevant information.

3 New members completing a membership form will be asked to confirm their agreement to the above arrangements.

4 Photographs taken that include junior members without permission of parents/guardians these will not be printed in our newsletter or shown on the website. If permission is granted no names will be displayed to accompany the relevant photograph. If any names are required they will only be disclosed with the consent of the parents/guardians.

5 Members leaving the club any information stored on the above PC and Laptop will be removed within two months of the end of the subscription period ie 31<sup>st</sup> March.

6 Any correspondence sent from members electronically that requires printing will be dealt with and then the relevant e-mail deleted and the printed copy shredded.

7 The website – no information on members to be stored on the website such as addresses, e-mail details and telephone numbers. Principal Officers to have a KMBC e-mail address. Remaining committee members must give consent to have their names on the website. Please note no information is stored on the website other than their names.

**FLYING NIGHT WEDNESDAY 14TH MARCH BATLEY SPORTS CENTRE** - The March club night will start at 8.00 pm for club news and we will then move down to the Sports Hall for flying. No outdoor shoes are allowed in the sports hall, trainers or socks please. £1 for club members to fly and £2 for non-club members to fly. We usually have planes, helicopters and drones of varying sizes. A good night to participate but enjoyable if you just want to stand on the balcony and watch, so why not come along?

**Report by Stan Reffin PR Officer** - So far this year the weather has not been too kind to us at Wilton Park, with many Sunday mornings being cold, frosty, strong winds but with the occasional sunny spell. We have needed to break the ice on a couple of occasions. Despite the cold weather we have had a good attendance of members sailing a variety of models.
